#### Expectations and Goals

It is expected that the kids know how to recite the Arabic Alphabet. If your child does not know, please make sure to practice with them at home. In addition to review of recitation, our goal is to have the kids be able to write and recognize the whole Arabic Alphabet by the end of Fall Semester insha'Allah. During the Spring Semester, we will continue to practice writing and recognizing the alphabet. In addition, we hope to memorize Surah Fatiha, Surah Ihklaas and Surah An-Nas, with by the end of the year and Surah Al-Falaq with vocabulary. Our Islamic studies will include knowledge of the 5 Pillars along with stories of various Prophets and the beginning steps to take for Prayer.

**We strive to encourage Islamic behavior (honesty, caring, truthfulness, honoring commitments..) thru Islamic stories and lessons from the Quran.**

While we will review the information above with the kids during class, it is important that kids spend additional time outside the classroom to review what we have learned especially with parents due to their age. A good half hour a week will be sufficient or to reiterate better, 5 minutes a day after salah can be helpful.

## Homework

Each week students will be given a homework assignment to complete during the week. The homework will be a review of the information we have covered in class.

- Islamic studies: Chapter Review Questions will be completed in class
- Arabic studies: Students should be able to recognize letters through continuous memorization and review with the “create our own Arabic book”
- Quranic studies: Vocabulary words should be memorized and short surah should be reviewed and memorized as well. Flash cards will be made during class for surahs we will study vocabulary for
